Connecting ancestral knowledge with cutting-edge technology is the gateway to innovative solutions for the challenges of humanity.

OBJECTIVES

The Ancestors of the Future Fund is philanthropic, non-profit, non-religious, and non-political, created in partnership between the Alok Institute, The Welight Institute and the UN Global Compact, with a focus on providing technical and financial support through projects that empower indigenous peoples in Brazil in culture and entertainment, environmental conservation and regeneration and quality of life in indigenous villages.







AREAS OF INVESTMENT

INDIGENOUS CULTURAL EXPRESSION

Production by Indigenous filmmakers in cinema, music, games, and web3, empowering them to have a prominent presence with artistic and communicational quality in the "audiovisual territory," contributing to the redefinition of Indigenous peoples in the collective imagination of society.

"There is a huge prejudice against us, against Indigenous peoples. They say we are savages. But we want to show our perspective, our art, our culture." (MC Owerá)

TECHNOLOGY AND FOREST

The use of technology for the well-being in Indigenous communities and accessing solutions for sustainable land use, monitoring threats, improving access to healthcare, education, communication, and energy generation.

"What we did with Alok was record our music to pass it on from generation to generation because one day it would be necessary to share it with people who have no knowledge of what the forest is." (Rasu Yawanawa)

TRAINING IN COMPUTING

Empowering young Indigenous individuals to engage with information technology for entrepreneurship and employment opportunities in urban areas, as well as to propose solutions for the well-being within Indigenous communities.

"We have the knowledge about the issues that affect our territories, and with our ancestral technology and contemporary technology, we can create the solutions ourselves." (Iskukua Yawanawa)



RECODE PRO ALDEIA

Training young Indigenous individuals as full-stack developers, equipping them with the skills needed to enter the job market successfully. Through this training program, we aim to promote entrepreneurship and leverage technology to create solutions specifically tailored for Indigenous communities.

NATIVE SOUND

We specialize in professionally recording albums that showcase the captivating musical culture of Brazil's Indigenous peoples. Our studio sessions feature a fusion of traditional and contemporary music from distinct Indigenous groups such as the Yawanawa, Huni Kuin, Kariri Xocó, Guarani, Guarani Mbya, and Kaingang communities. Through these recordings, our goal is to highlight the beauty and diversity of Indigenous music while raising awareness and appreciation for their cultural heritage.
